Financial Aid:

Kroka Expeditions is a financial needs-blind institution, with financial aid decisions made after admissions decisions. We are committed to allowing participation to everyone regardless of income. Financial aid ranges from 10% to 30% of the full tuition depending on family income and circumstances.

If you are applying for financial aid you must attach the following:

- A completed Financial Aid Form
- Your most recent tax forms
- If parents are separated or divorced you must provide a letter explaining each parent's responsibility towards child support and educational expenses and supply tax forms for both parents

Your financial aid application will be returned if incomplete.

Public school funds may be available. Check with your school district.

Also, we have a fundraising support package for individual families with ideas on how to accomplish raising part of the tuition. It can be mailed upon request. In the past, many of the students raised over half of their tuition through small \$25 donations.
